#### A LETTER FROM RICHARD SIMMONDS

Dear Maggi

Do you remember Judy and me? We were part of the committee of Eastern Region for many years with Dave Hicks, Alan Kempster and Robin Weston. I don't know how aware of our lives you are since we left the club.

Judy and I continued living at Woodside Green until last August (51 years in the cottage). We have built an annexe to our daughter's house in Sheering, very different and easy to maintain. Our daughter's are well into their forties and we have 5 Grandchildren ranging from 24 to 8. We always had plans to rebuild our Healey 3000 and when the franchise was stopped by BMC, I bought several spares from Marshall's in Cambridge. We never achieved that plan and recently sold the car to a Mark Richards. I am left with the Spares which I wish to sell. They deserve a home where they will be used to help maintain the marque.

Obviously, the members of the Healey Club are the best people to use these parts. **Photos on our website** – **Ed**. The Spares are stored in a dry garage and I can arrange for them to be viewed before sale. PS. Dave and Wyvern separated many years ago and Dave moved to Normandy. Cycling got him involved in the local community but he now has dementia. Robin and Sandra hear about him occasionally.

Alan and Christine moved to Devon and became heavily involved with the Jensen Club and then the South Devon vintage and veteran club. Christine developed cancer and Alan looked after her so well but she died last year and not long after, Alan was diagnosed with the same type of cancer. He is still with us but there is no cure for this type of cancer.

Robin and Sandra also moved to France, initially the Dordogne but now near Limoges. We have seen them several times and they stayed with us for Christine's funeral.

#### SPRITE HISTORY

With the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the introduction of the Sprite this summer it is interesting to look at the development of the Sprite and below I have used extracts from Geoffrey Healey's book, More Healeys from 1978 where he looks at the concept and its development.

After my discussion with DMH (Donald Healey), I was left with a lot of sketches and the OK to design and produce two prototypes. One idea was to make a car with a nearly identical front and rear end. Although this is possible, the end result is never pleasing and we did not pursue it.

I next told Barry Bilbie, our chassis designer, and Gerry Coker, our body designer, what we were going to do, at the same time emphasizing the need for the utmost security. I had decided that we should use the A35's front suspension, and engine and the basic case and track of its rear axle, with a 4.22 to 1 ratio.

One of the features of the first prototype were its pop-up headlamps. The car was very low and the headlamps had to meet a British regulation of 26 inches between the lamp centre and the ground. This ruled out any possibility of fitting the lamps conventionally in the wings.



The two lamps were fixed onto hinges joined by a tube and activated mechanically so that they would swing up and forward to their operating position. When not in use, the lamps lay back flush with the bonnet. Unfortunately, in conjunction with the one-piece bonnet hinged at the back, this mechanism proved too complex and expensive, and was installed only on the first prototype. Porsche later used an almost identical pop-up headlamp system on their 928 model.

I had rejected the mechanically operated rear brakes of the A35, however, as these were not completely trouble-free and the installation would have presented some ground clearance problems.

# Sprite development continued....

I decided to go for all hydraulic brakes. It was quite remarkable what performance was obtained with small and light 7 inch diameter brakes. The rear suspension consisted of two quarter elliptic leaf springs and two Armstrong dampers with long arms forming the upper torque reaction members. The aim was positive axle location with low unsprung weight.

Everything was kept as simple as possible: The seat frames came from the Austin Healey 100, with greatly cheapened trim, while the external door hinges were very similar to those used on the 100 boot or trunk.



DMH finally pronounced himself satisfied with the prototype and rang up George Harriman at Longbridge, telling him that he had something to show him. Leonard Lord was now gradually handing over control of BMC to George who had been made managing director and deputy chairman of the group earlier in 1956.

George told DMH to bring the car over on 31st January 1957 and to put it in the garage under the Kremlin this being the nickname of the head office block at Longbridge. DMH and I duly drove over on the day, cleaned off the mud and showed him the car. After a thorough inspection, he was obviously impressed and said that he would like Sir Leonard Lord to see it on his return on 20th February. Whilst Harriman was by now effectively running BMC, Len Lord still liked to be consulted. He, too, approved the car and it was decided then and there that Austin should make it under the type number AN5.

DMH and Harriman agreed on conditions for its manufacture, while I drew up a provisional parts schedule and produced an estimate of costs. My figures came out to within £2 of those produced by Austin and. with the planned selling price of £450, promised an excellent profit per unit.
