I attended the March Norfolk Noggin' with Terry Sprosson which gave me the opportunity to see how he is getting on with his E-Type that he is restoring from basket case to concours standard. It is looking fabulous and has reached the stage where the engine and transmission are about to be fitted following completion of the bodywork and interior trim. Terry has 'previous' with restorations having completed AH 100, Alfa Guilia, Jag 140, Healey boat and fettled his Model A. Apologies, Terry, if I have forgotten one or two!

We generally attend the H&H Duxford preview day together and it is informative to hear his comments on the Jags up for sale! This year as usual there were loads of Jags including a batch of LHD imports for restoration including the wreck below that had a estimate of £16-20K. Not surprisingly the latter did not sell, there not being any redeeming features that I could see!

The only 'Healey' was a Sebring big Healey replica that sold for £18.5k, not the most attractive of the 'clones' in my eyes, the windscreen pillars being chunky apparently due to US roll-over requirements.


