CHAIRMAN'S CHAT

We were out and about in the Hundred a bit more in August, a lovely run across to Derbyshire for a few days ending with a visit to the Midlands Centre planned Drive and Sunday Lunch. It just proves that running a Healey is a great way to get out and about and have a great time with friends. Other mileage added has mainly been testing.

I had the car MOT'd when we returned and took the opportunity to have a look around while it was up in the air, there had been a few more spots of oil underneath recently and the traces were there showing the pinion seal was weeping, along with a rear hub seal and the rear shock absorbers. The front carburettor was showing signs of a fuel leak and the jet didn't raise fully when off choke so I have been spending a bit of time fettling. I had also noticed a bit of vibration at higher speeds so I decided to bite the bullet and fit a new propshaft as I was ordering bits anyway. The propshaft seems to have done the trick, the UJ's were fine but I think it was wear in the sliding spline allowing some lateral movement.

We will be doing a few longer trips in September so hopefully it will be smoother running and less of a trail of oil to follow. With the carburettors rebuilt I am hoping for at least 40mpg!

I couldn't get to the Little Gransden Air Show but I have been told it was a brilliant day out with great air displays. The Club Gazebo was in demand giving some much needed shade and the row of Healeys looked magnificent. Probably just as well I wasn't there to lower the standard with my well "patinated" old wreck. I gather Angela Bonner's Hundred had a bit of fettling done to the charging circuit and I know of another Hundred that suffered a fuel pump problem on the way home, hopefully all sorted now.

September still has some events to tempt you out; there is the Redbourne classic car show and the Sywell Pistons and Props airshow. All details are in the calendar on the website or contact Angela Bonner for more information.
