

MY CURRENT 3000 from Tony Withrington

Found a photo of my '64 Mk111 3000 phase 2. These were taken about 3 years ago outside Landwades Hall near Newmarket, before it was sold off as a wedding venue. The weather was perfect for once and shows the car off well!



I had a '65 Mk3 for a few years in the 70's and was determined to find another one as I headed for my retirement! The car was imported from Sweden just before I bought it and the front indicator lights were the wrong way round. The amber should be below the headlight but there is a certain logic to having the sidelight below the headlight so I have left it as is!

The chrome flashes on the wings I have changed - they were broad end facing forwards! How anyone can get this wrong is beyond me! However, I spotted a red Healey in the Haynes museum off the A303 a couple of years ago which had them reversed - think it had a foreign plate!

All the ambla vinyl trim is original and it benefits from an adjustable steering column and an oil cooler. Chrome wires are non standard 72 spoke 6.5J (originals were 4.5J) and I had the thin whitewall tyres fitted. The exhaust is side exit with two silencers rather than the standard four silencer rear exit.

The car has done a number of trips to Cornwall, as well as Silverstone and Goodwood and I find the revised suspension of the phase two comfortable for long runs.

CAMBRIDGE CAR CLUB CLASSIC RUN 2020 Sunday 19 April 2020



The Cambridge Car Club has the use of The Imperial War Museum at Duxford as the base for the 10th running of their Classic run. The entry fee is £60.00 per car with two occupants. An additional fee of £22 will be charged for each additional passenger to cover the cost of entry to the venues. A road book, numbered rally plate and any other documentation will be handed to participants at signing on.

Participants will follow a scenic circular route of approximately 80 miles on quiet roads through Cambridgeshire and neighbouring counties. A shorter route will be available for anyone wishing to do less miles and return to the museum earlier. As last year there will be a coffee stop at Carver Barracks airfield the WSMC will be holding an AutoSolo event.

To make it more interesting this year, there will be a sample AutoSolo test which you can attempt in your own car. This is completely optional and without official timing. You will be able go round the test at your own pace. It should be great fun. You will also be able to see other competitors doing the actual timed sections on the AutoSolo proper which will be running on other parts of the airfield.

Participants will have full access to the IWM on their return to Duxford.
