


Lockdown lament: Angela's Can't Drive it Day!

We have had confirmation that Classic Le Mans will be postponed until 2021 but of course it is difficult to make plans that far ahead when everything is getting pushed back, it looks as though it will be hard to choose what to do.

I did SORN my modern and the Hundred will get used on the monthly run to collect prescriptions, but even going the long way round isn't much of a drive. Everything that doesn't move in the garden has been painted, so at least that has been getting rid of the collection of half-finished paint tins from the shed.

Work has progressed a bit on the BJ8 but I keep finding other bits that need attention that I had totally forgotten about during its rest period of several years. It was a LHD conversion done about 30 years ago, I used it as it was for a couple of years, putting up with its foibles. One of which was that the wiper's park position was not changed. Now not being someone who does things the easy way I couldn't resist the chance to "upgrade" to two speed wipers as I have an old Reliant Scimitar set up lying around doing nothing. Let's face it where's the fun in just fitting new arms and twiddling the "park" contact! I did perform this modification on the Westland and by using the Reliant switchgear you also get electric washers on the same switch. That obviously produces another problem as the pump would empty the original washer bottle with one press, so the hunt is on for a suitable hiding place for a reasonable size reservoir.

I will also be converting to negative earth while I am playing, the Rev Counter needs a clean and check anyway as it was over reading so while I am in there with the soldering iron I might as well swop a couple of wires over. I don't think I will fit an alternator just now, but going negative will mean it will be an easy job at a later date.

The Heater modification is more or less done, the adaptor plate needs painting and I need to sort out the fresh air ducting into the heater and up to the de-mist vents. I should be able to utilise the original controls so the only modern switch will be for the three-speed fan which should be easy to place out of sight.

Whether it was worth all the effort won't really be known until we are able to use it in inclement weather, let's hope I can give an update by Christmas.

Once all the modifications have been done the fun will really start, I took it apart a number of years ago so:

- Problem one; remembering where I put everything: Problem two; remembering how it all goes back together.
- Problem two isn't really a problem as there are manuals showing where it all goes.

Problem one could be the major stumbling block, I will have to have a chat with some squirrels to find out how they remember where their nuts are! [Problem three will be wondering what to do with all the left over bits, and what should go in any holes that are left that don't fit the bits that are left over!]

Don't forget even though we can't carry on with the noggins your committee is just an email away if you have a question regarding your Healey and with the extended fettling period I hope to see many of you about later in the year. We would like to think that normal service will be resumed as soon as possible. Keep an eye on the website and look out for emails from our membership secretary, we will pass on any news as soon as we get it.

Some lovely Healeys were present, including no 36, a triple SU rally Healey prepared by JME of Warwick. Another Healey in films for you; The 1960 film "School for Scoundrels" (starring Ian Carmichael, Terry Thomas and Alastair Sim - to name a few) used the 1958 ex works demonstrator 100/6 registered PJB 828 as you will see below. This car was sold to a Ted Worswick in 1963 who uprated it to the then 3000 works specification (with the assistance of the Abingdon competition department). Ted Worswick successfully raced the car for quite a few years and competed with and beat, on occasions, John Chatham in his SAL 75.

Obviously the car must have gone through various hands since but it appeared and sold at a Goodwood Bonhams Auction in 2012 for £85,500. The CVLA website lists the car as still existing but SORNed.



RACING WITH STIRLING

After the sad news about Sir Stirling Moss passing away I thought back to the time when I was fortunate enough to take part in a race with the great man himself. The place was the Goodwood Revival meeting in 2006, the Fordwater trophy 30 car grid including 13 various Sprite based cars, Morgans, Triumph, Sunbeams, MG`s and various others Having only raced for 20 months Goodwood was another world, the hospitality, the atmosphere, the cars and the crowd. After the usual signing on and scrutineering it was time for the drivers briefing,

entering the building 10 minutes early, I was surprised how many drivers for our race were already there, the last couple of rows of seats were empty so going for a space on the back row I realised that Stirling Moss was sitting on the end chair nearest the exit with his racing helmet resting on the neighbouring seat, thinking I should keep my distance he removed his helmet from the seat, presuming he was offering the seat, I sat beside him. Saying thanks I sat down wondering if I should "chat," I asked if he had to attend the drivers briefing he told me at least it showed willing, I then asked how he was allowed to race wearing his traditional silk racing overalls his reply was that he had signed so many pieces of paper in the past that he could possibly race in his underpants and they could not stop him, the briefing then began and my only conversation with Stirling Moss ended.

My race practice plan was to follow Stirling as best I could (how difficult would that be he was 76 years old driving a car he wasn`t used to). I think Goodwood wanted Stirling to go out first, however I think he had other ideas, luckily I was far down the paddock so I went out 2 cars behind Stirling. I've got to admit it was not easy, each lap he was just getting a little bit further away, after 6 or 7 laps feeling slightly deflated I put in a good couple of laps and I could see his car getting closer, (time to give it a bit more I thought) harder and harder I tried and finally he was in overtaking range my moment of glory came on the Lavant straight where I slipped past him and never saw him again (the truth is he was suffering fuel problems and retired on lap 8).

Next day the race, unlike the practice, the track was damp and slippery. On the 15 row grid I was on row 12, Stirling on row 10 less than 1.5 seconds a lap separated rows 10/11/12 .

Goodwood, Clive and Sir Stirling continued...

The race was on and soon there were casualties with breakdowns and a couple of incidents. I could see Stirling and was confident I could catch him, however towards the end of the race with Stirling the car in front of me and a MGB Berlinetta close on my tail determined to overtake I pushed hard into the Lavant corner and the back end swung out. When I finally opened my eyes I was parked on the grass 90 degrees to the track, luckily engine still revving so I re-joined the track, by this time 4 cars had passed me.

3 laps later the race was over only 19 of the 30 cars that started crossed the finishing line, unfortunately I never caught up with Stirling on the track or afterwards.

At least I can say that in my entire racing career in races with the great Sir Stirling Moss he never overtook me.
