ROB'S RAMBLINGS

I was sad to hear of the death of Mike Garton earlier this month.

Mike was a former motorcycle scrambler who came to Geoffrey Healey's notice due to success with 'MEG', his Sprite MEG199, distinctive in gleaming red with its Ashley bonnet and hardtop.

Mike had managed to get an entry for MEG in the 1963 Nurburgring 500km race. Apocryphally Geoff invited him to Warwick 'and bring the flyer'. Geoff asked whether he would like to buy 1411 WD, the Le Mans Coupé Sprite, Mike said that he couldn't afford it. After several puffs on his ever-present pipe Geoff told him to hitch it up anyway, leaving MEG at Warwick and Mike £100 lighter but with a full race car behind his VW Caravette.

In 1965 he sold the Sprite and bought a Lotus 23B. For the rest of the 1960s he raced a variety of British sports cars at national and international level, including Sprites, MGBs, a Mini Marcos and even raced in the European Touring Car Championship. For the last three years of his racing career he raced Chevrons - a B8 in 1970, a B16 in 1971 and a B21 in 1972.

After retiring from racing in 1972, he became chief scrutineer for the BRDC and later oversaw the various Rover one-make race championships. He was then appointed as an MSA technical commissioner and FIA technical delegate with a principal involvement in Group C racing for many years*.

A wonderful career and someone that will be missed by all that met him.

Still apart, but THEY have decided that 'at least one metre plus' with increased social awareness will suffice!! As I write we have just seen the ridiculous situation on Bournemouth beach last weekend, with crowds shoulder to shoulder in the sweltering heat. Why anyone would want to be anywhere in a crush like that, Covid or no Covid I simply cannot imagine. It goes to show that whatever advice the Government give out there will still be an awful lot of people with no regard or respect for it, and precious little thought for those in the vulnerable category who they might mix with in the following weeks.

As stated last month, the pool / picnic party here in Helions Bumpstead on 26th July has been postponed, we are hoping it may be possible to hold it later in the year but this will depend on factors beyond our control. Apart from the obvious necessary lifting of more restrictions on mass gatherings, I am very conscious of the probable age group of attendees, in the high risk bracket. To be fair I was on the way to have the flexi section replaced anyway, but it did make for an extremely noisy drive and some odd looks when I stopped for fuel. However, now all is fixed, we have a shiny new and slightly modernized mid-section, and a fair dollop of TLC administered, so the quiet purr is back, (unless my right foot starts feeling heavy anyway!)

Please look at the calendar carefully, almost everything we had planned has been cancelled or rescheduled, many will skip this year altogether. Some larger events have already posted their date for 2021, including the MG LIVE and Goodwood Revival, so make a list until you have a next year's diary available. Goodwood are offering to accept your ticket for this year on the new date in 2021.

If you don't want a refund on the grounds that the already expensive ticket price will possibly increase for 2021, if you can commit to a date so far in advance I suggest carrying it over might be the way to go.

THEY are lifting restrictions gradually, although it seems haphazard at the very least and I often wonder at the logic of what is being changed. The fact we can go into most shops now but not have a haircut or visit several family members at the same time without distancing does seem a little odd. Restrictions on haircuts lift very shortly but I suspect there will be an extremely long queue for both ladies and gents appointments. My own hairdresser is not even open for bookings yet.

All information correct at time of writing but changing by the minute, so be careful if you book advance tickets on line. The small print may say they are under no obligation to refund or replace tickets for reasons beyond their control, and I suspect Covid is one of those reasons.

Check before travelling anywhere, some places may in theory be open, but the facilities may not be. Even if you take a vacuum flask there is not much room in a Healey for a Portaloo!!

There is still a lot to be thankful for, the weather has largely been amazing, to the point that here we were desperate for rain on the garden and paddock. Having arranged for some tree surgery they were due to come the day we had a rainstorm of biblical quantities and had to delay for a day, and as I write there is some serious pruning going on out there. I shan't like it but it's needed and the 'haircut' will do the willow a lot of good. Great, isn't it, I can get a haircut for my

trees but not myself!!

The seats went off to be trimmed in leather again out of our league but when I came to fit them they are out of a very late car and the fitting bolts didn't meet up with the holes in the floor, many hours of modification but all good now. Good to have this work to do in this period of shielding, we have not been bored.

ME AND MY CAR: JOANNA HILL

My name is Joanna and my partner Jon and I recently joined the Austin Healey Club.

I inherited my father's 1961 BT7 Austin Healey 3000 MkII last year, a car he owned since before I was born so I've known it forever and it goes without saying that it is my all time favourite car.

Dad used it as a road and rally car in the early days before using it to hill climb in the late 80s which is when I got the bug for racing too. He won his class at the Brighton Speed Trials many times and did well at Prescott and the Isle of Mann Manx Classic. Prescott was always great fun, although one year it rained so hard that the cars parked in the paddock started sliding sideways down the hill!

In around 1996, after a major rebuild done by Dad himself, he had a big accident at Porlock (happily no one was hurt) but the car was very badly damaged.

I was in my late teens then and spent most evenings stripping the car down ready to be repaired.

The car was rebuilt as a dedicated race car by Radford Racing so no more driving to and from the circuits in the Healey! I now had to learn to load and secure the car on to trailers. We had lots of fun at Masters and HSCC events at Silverstone, Brands Hatch, Snetterton, Goodwood and elsewhere, surrounded by all the sights, sounds and smells of classic motor sport.

Later he raced in various events with the Healey and also a Chevron B8 and E-Type Jaguar, including the Silverstone Classic, Autosport Three Hour and he successfully completed the Spa Six Hour on a number of occasions in the Healey, his best finish being p25 behind the GT40s, Lolas and light weight E's. What wonderful times we had.

So I can get as much use out of the car as possible I am having it made road legal although it will retain its racing engine and gearbox so it's going to be a bit of a beast to drive on the roads but fun none the less.

I also have a little 1996 Mini Cooper S which I raced in the BRSCC Mighty Mini series for a couple of seasons before I had my son. Henry is now six and loves motor racing too.

I hope, in the future, to be able to race the Healey, maybe starting with Hill Climbing or indeed the Austin Healey Club series!

Due to the current situation I, unfortunately, don't yet have the car back but I can't wait to get it out on the roads, meet other club members and join in with the great looking program of events that you organise.

I attach three photographs, the first two are in honour of my wonderful father, Andrew Hill, who passed away suddenly and unexpectedly last June, who can be seen here, doing what he loved most, racing his Austin Healey at Spa Francorchamps, also below winning at Silverstone in one of his other cars, a Chevron B8.



The one on the front cover is the Healey newly arrived at my house before it went Scott Automotive to be made road legal.

We live in Little Downham near Ely although I'm originally from Sussex which I where my father lived.

I'm pretty sure he was a member of the AHC, I certainly recognise the magazines from on his desk.

I look forward to meeting everyone soon.
